The city benefits from a central geographic location, and has an excellent road, rail and air network with daily flights to London Stansted.

There is so much on offer - Dundee proudly celebrates its seafaring heritage. RRS Discovery, which was built in the city, is the vessel sailed by Captain Robert Falcon Scott on his first voyage to Antarctica in 1901. Whilst at City Quay you will discover one of the oldest British built wooden frigates still afloat, HM Frigate Unicorn.

Visit the award winning textile heritage centre, Scotland's Jute Museum @ Verdant Works including the newly refurbished High Mill or The McManus: Dundee's Art Gallery and Museum, home to one of Scotland's most impressive collections of fine and decorative art. Visit Dundee's Museum of Transport and explore the city's cultural quarter, where the Dundee Repertory Theatre offers a wide range of genres and Dundee Contemporary Art housing two cinemas and contemporary art exhibitions. Behind the DCA you will find Dundee Science Centre.

Enjoy discovering Dundee city centre where the Overgate is the jewel in Dundee's retail crown. With its unique curved glass wall it is the only single sided mall in Europe. It is home to department stores and a host of well known high street names - truly a shopper's paradise.

Look out for Dundee's character statues



The pedestrianised High Street leads from the Overgate to Murraygate and to the Wellgate Shopping Centre which is home to a variety of retailers offering fantastic value shopping. Gallagher Retail Park is also within easy walking distance and offers major retail stores and plenty of parking.

Dundee also boasts two football clubs, an indoor climbing centre, outdoor activity centre with dry ski slope, sailing and kayaking as well as the Green Circular Route for walking and cycling which circumnavigates Dundee. HMS Frigate Unicorn - City Quay

HMS Frigate Unicorn is Scotland's only preserved warship. Launched in 1824 as a 46 gun frigate, the Unicorn is now also one of the oldest British-built ships afloat and the last ship left in the world to have survived from the golden age of sail almost completely as she was built.

Mills Observatory

The Mills Observatory, reached by a picturesque stroll up Balgay Hill, is Britain's only full time public observatory and houses powerful telescopes and a permanent astronomy exhibition. Visitors can enjoy breathtaking views of the stars and planets through a very impressive Victorian telescope. The new state of the art telescope makes it possible to hop from one object in the dark skies to another. Check the website for opening hours as they vary depending on the time of year. Booking may also be necessary.

Entry fee includes a chance to view the recently restored High Mill and exhibitions.

Situated at the mouth of the Tay, the castle has a magnificent view over the river and is only minutes away from Broughty Ferry Beach and Esplanade.

Castle Green play ground is also close by with many activities on offer. Free admission to Castle Museum - open all year.

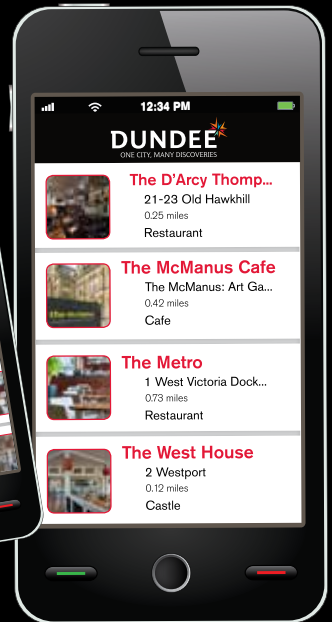
